Mystic Seaport

- **North of Long Island Sound**
- **South of Pawcatuck**

This museum first opened in 1929, almost 100 years ago! It is home to the Charles W. Morgan, a famous ship that is the only wooden whaling ship left in the world! Each year, twenty-five thousand people visit the museum!

Nathan Hale Homestead

- **Close to the Willimantic River**
- **East of Manchester**

This is a special Connecticut Landmark because it is the family home of Connecticut's state hero, Nathan Hale! Nathan was brave because he was a spy in the American Revolution. This house has been in his family since 1776.

Frog Bridge

- **North of Colchester**
- **South of Storrs**

The Frog Bridge celebrates a silly event from 1754, more than 300 years ago! One hot summer night, the people who lived there got scared because all of a sudden they heard horrible shrieking! They had no idea what could be making the horrible sound. In the morning, they found out that tons of bullfrogs had been fighting!

Aldrich Library

- **North of Jewett City**
- **South of Danielson**
- **Close to the Quinnebaug River**

This library first opened on George Washington's Birthday, February 22, 1896! That's more than 200 years ago! It's in the Moosup part of Plainfield. You can walk here from Moosup Elementary School! Families go to the library to borrow great books, and to get passes to fun museums like the Science Center.
